MSDE’s Headliners & Legends

In February 2010, **Woody Grant**, was recognized during a 3-day event in Richmond, VA as one of the “*Richmond 34*” - individuals who made civil rights history some 50 years ago by leading sit-ins to integrate restaurants and stores. While hundreds of people participated in the sit-in movement, Woody and 33 others led the 1960 Richmond civil rights protests and were arrested for challenging Jim Crow Laws. The lawyer defending the group of protesters was Thurgood Marshall on behalf of the NAACP. A tribute memorial honoring the protesters was dedicated on the campus of Virginia Union College, where Woody was a student activist and leader. As part of the commemorative event, Woody spoke to students about his civil rights experiences and about the importance of activism for social justice. – Submitted by L. Shevitz
