Adding New Certification Areas

APPROVAL

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this item is to request your approval of proposed changes to COMAR 13A.12.01.13, which governs the addition of certification areas to professional certificates. These amendments were considered and acted upon (publication) by the Professional Standards and Teacher Education Board (PSTEB) at its meeting on April 3, 2007. Subsequently, you reviewed the proposal at your meeting on April 30, 2008. The proposed changes will provide clarification for adding endorsement(s) to existing professional certificates for teachers only and will add the recently created category of middle school to others enumerated in the regulation.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND:

An initial change in regulation pertaining to adding new certification areas was grounded in a recommendation made by the Quality Teacher Work Group in its report of February, 2003:

It is recommended that professionally certificated personnel may receive additional endorsements on their certificates by:

- i. Taking a minimum of 30 credits (appropriately distributed) in a specified content area or
- ii. Passing the Praxis II in that content area.

The effect of this change was to enable teachers holding valid professional certification to add endorsement(s) in a more streamlined way. The rationale for the recommendation of the Quality Teacher Work Group and the proposed regulatory change was based on Maryland's continuing need to attract and retain highly qualified teachers, recognition that certificated teachers already possess pedagogy skills, and focus on alignment with teacher quality provisions of federal legislation, *No Child Left Behind* (NCLB).

Subsequently, in October, 2004 the PSTEB adopted a second change to this regulation, which further clarified that adding new certification areas was designed only for teachers, not for other professionally certificated individuals such as guidance counselors. Unfortunately, adopted wording was unintentionally ambivalent, referring to "teaching areas" and inadvertently permitting specialists and administrators to add subject-area endorsements.

In June, 2005 the PSTEB adopted a third change to this same regulation, which delineated the requirements for coursework and clarified the potential use of related content along with specific content. In presenting this change, the reference to "teachers" was inadvertently eliminated from the regulation. Due to this oversight, the regulation currently permits any individual holding a professional certificate to add a teaching area; this is clearly contradictory to the original intent of this regulatory change and the Quality Teacher Work Group recommendation. Since administrator and specialist preparation programs do not include pedagogy, adding teaching endorsements solely on the basis of content is inappropriate for these areas.

This proposed amendment was presented and discussed at the PSTEB meeting on March 6, 2008, and members requested consideration for publication in April. In the intervening weeks, staff review led to a non-substantive refinement beyond that presented at the March meeting. Subsequent to the regulatory activity described herein, Maryland has adopted middle school certification (COMAR 13A.12.02.05) through action by the PSTEB and the Maryland State Board of Education in 2005. Along with the amendment developed initially in March, the final proposal includes language to address the exclusion of middle school-certificated teachers from the options afforded under COMAR 13A.12.01.13. The PSTEB voted to publish the proposed regulations at its meeting on April 3, 2007. Subsequently, you reviewed the proposal at your meeting on April 30, 2008 and determined that a Joint Conference Committee was not necessary prior to publication.

A copy of the proposed COMAR amendment, as published in the *Maryland Register* on June 20, 2008 is attached. The period for public comment concluded on July 21, 2008, and no comments were submitted. Proposed COMAR 13A.12.01.13 does not have any economic impact, nor does it have any impact on individuals with disabilities. There is no corresponding federal standard for this proposed action.

SUMMARY:

Adoption of the proposed changes to COMAR13A.12.01.13, Adding New Certification Areas, will provide clarification of the existing language to align with the original intent of the recommendation of the Quality Teacher Work Group and the subsequent changes to the regulation that have previously been adopted. Adding an endorsement on the basis of content, either through course work or an assessment, will be an option limited to professionally certificated teachers whose credentials include pedagogical qualifications. The proposed amendment also adds middle school as an eligible category for the options provided in this regulation. A copy of the proposed COMAR amendment, as published in the *Maryland Register* on June 20, 2008 is attached.
