ADULT EDUCATION/ JUDY CENTER PARTNERSHIPS

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What is an Adult Education/Judy Center partnership?

The Maryland Literacy Works Adult Education Program, funded by the Maryland Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation, provides services to parents through the 24 Judy Centers around the state. Adult Education instruction is offered onsite at many of the centers, and in others the partnership refers parents to a nearby Maryland Literacy Works location.

How does Adult Education support the mission of the Judy Centers? Judy Centers provide comprehensive, integrated, full-day full-year services that promote school readiness for children from birth through the age of five. The families access services that support child development as an essential part of the mission. Adult Education provides instruction for parents to learn the skills necessary to function as a full partner in their children's education, while increasing their own academic skills.

What Adult Education services are available through the Adult Education/Judy Center partnerships?

The Adult Education programs address a wide variety of needs which may include English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL), basic academic skills review, General Educational Development (GED) test preparation, the Maryland Adult External High School Diploma (EDP), and career exploration assistance or referral. Adults are assisted with transitions to employment and/or higher education and training. Through parent training the adults access information regarding child development, health and socialization with emphasis on the parent as the child's first teacher.
