Dear Maryland Educator:

In September 2014, America will commemorate the 200th anniversary of the Star-Spangled Banner. Maryland and Marylanders played a pivotal role in the causes, conduct and outcomes of the War of 1812, and created two of the proudest symbols of America-the flag and the anthem-while the Chesapeake was engulfed in War.

Many bicentennial activities are being planned for Maryland in 2014 for the K-12 audience in virtual and non-virtual formats. Some of the most notable and easily accessible opportunities currently operating or planned include:

- Visiting <u>Fort McHenry National Monument and Historic Shrine</u>, especially to be a part of the <u>Bicentennial Living American Flag</u> on September 9, 2014.
- Discovering War of 1812 sites along the <u>Star-Spangled Banner National Historic Trail</u> in Maryland, Washington DC, and Virginia aided with the <u>Chesapeake Explorer</u> mobile app or printed guide, <u>In Full Glory Reflected</u>: <u>Discovering the War of 1812 in the Chesapeake</u>.
- Scheduling a trip for free tours of international tall ships and Navy vessels during **Star-Spangled Spectacular** in Baltimore, September 11-15.
- Exploring Maryland Public Television's (MPT) <u>War of 1812 website</u>, on Thinkport, for ample, engaging, internet-based home and classroom resources, including <u>Interactive</u> <u>Battlefield Maps</u>.
- Screening the Emmy award winning MPT-produced film, The War of 1812 on the Chesapeake; Home of the Brave.
- Participating in the Maryland State Arts Council's <u>National Anthem Sing-Off</u>, or the Maryland Humanities Council's <u>Maryland History Day/National History Day</u>.
